A still born son of JOHLE is also burried here.</p> <p>He must of left Washington County because of all the terrilbe event that had happened to his family.</p> <p>His 2 twins sons died in the same year in 1888. Then 2 years later his wife commited suicide by drinking poisin.</p>
